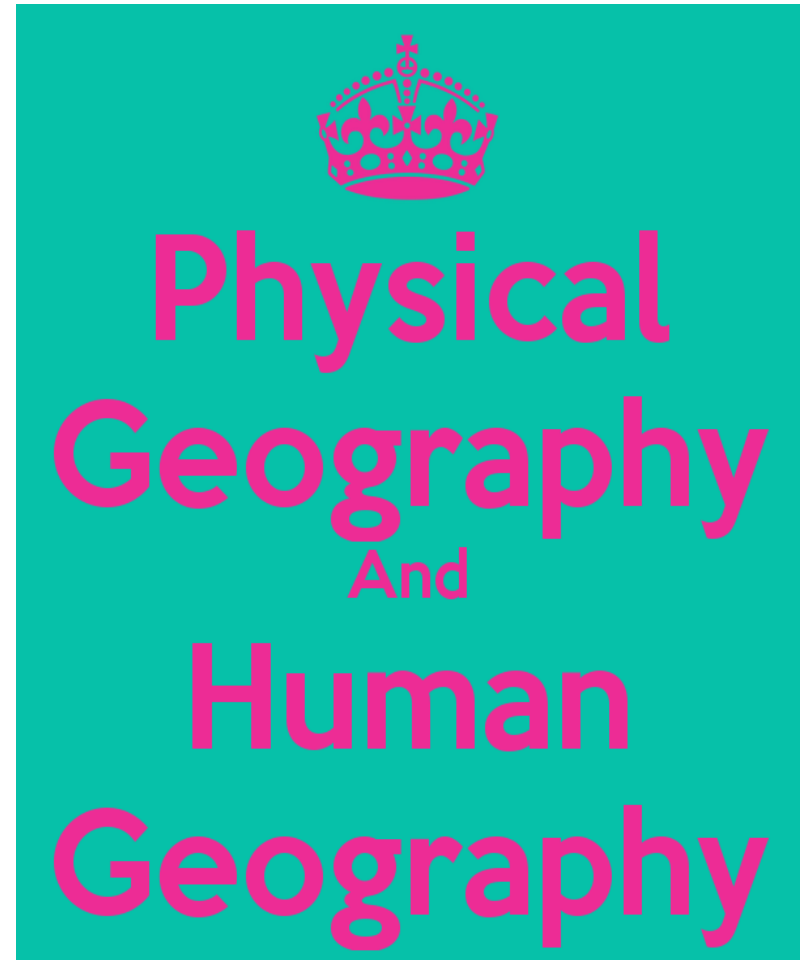


Bellwork

 - What are at least five key symbols or colors on the map?
 - What do they represent
 - What key information do these map shows?
 - Is this information about physical geography or human geography?



Objective

- I will be able to use geography skills to better understand the geography of Ancient Greece and its surrounding area by completing a mapping lab.

Directions for Assignment

- There will be 5 stations which will have you looking at 5 different types of maps
 - Physical Features
 - Climate Zones
 - Vegetation Zones
 - Population Density
 - Economic Activity
- At each station you will be answering two questions which will have you look at two different types of maps

Directions once you are at the station

- Step 1 – Take a look at the maps as well as the challenge questions
- Step 2 – As a group decide what type of map it is
 - Physical Features, Climate Zones, Vegetation Zones, Population Density, Economic Activity
- Step 3 – Answer the questions at correct spot on your worksheet
 - Example – If it is challenge question 2 then make sure you write in the box labeled 2
- Step 4 – Re-check your answers to make sure they are correct
