LDC Explanation

- The LDC for this unit introduced you to these ideas in the context of the 5 C's. Chaos, Collaboration, Conflict, Commands, Common Good.
- Prior to civilization there was chaos in simply remaining alive.
- Once groups of people worked together and collaborated in order to survive, more survived.
- Once in collaborative groups, human nature took over and there was a need to maintain and establish order within the groups. People entered into a social contract, an agreement with which a person enters into civil society. The contract essentially binds people into a community that exists for mutual preservation. In entering into civil society, people sacrifice the physical freedom of being able to do whatever they please, but they gain the civil freedom of being able to think and act rationally and morally. One person or small group dominated and commanded the way in which people must act or behave. There were strict penalties for not adhering to the rules set forth. Over time groups banded together to make more fair or equal rules for the whole. This thought of the common good is seen in our idea of popular sovereignty.
